METAS Teacher Job Description



Essential Function:

METAS is a partnership between SuCasa and Columbus Youth Camp that allows Latino youth to expand their reading and math skills during the summer months. This allows them to experience what CYC offers, such as Swimming, Archery, PowerPole, and much more. CYC has bilingual teachers who create the programming for METAS Youth. They can create positive relationships with other youth and are immersed in the outdoors. The METAS Teacher must help plan, organize, and implement activities. They should have cognitive and communication abilities to make important decisions, plan, and communicate necessary information to campers and staff. Physical ability to be present, lead camp activities, hike the trails, and handle the environmental conditions of Camp. Incorporate the Columbus Youth Camp model, *Respect Yourself, Respect Others, and Respect Camp* daily. Will help and support METAS teachers with activities. Will communicate with parents and inform them of upcoming events.

Hours and Pay: 8 weeks or one four-week session.

Session 1: June 2nd- June 27th. Session 2: July 7th- August 1st.

Pay begins at \$18/ hour ~ 20-24 hrs weekly, Closed on May 26th & July 4th

General Responsibility:

To create a curriculum based on the child's math and reading skills. You will be in charge of creating lesson plans in fun, safe, age-appropriate activities. Will work with campers ages 6-12 from the Bartholomew area representing its basic cultural and socio-economic makeup.

Activity Qualifications:

- Must be a bilingual Teacher, EL Teacher is a plus
- Must be Proficient in Spanish
- Demonstrated experience working with youth
- Enthusiastic when engaging and or assisting youth in activities
- Current CPR and First Aid certified preferred (any other certifications, such as life-guarding, are a plus)
- Ability to perform duties in a professional and organized manner, work well as part of a team
- Ability to lead lesson plans and supervise youth with an emphasis on safety
- Ability to maintain control of the group and follow the risk management plan
- Must assist with cleaning and maintaining each area
- Must be able to stand for long periods and lift heavy objects of up to 20bls
- Available 9:30 am to 3:30 pm, Tuesday- Thursday starting May 28th- July 25th.
- Required Training Dates: May 22-24th 2024

Specific Responsibilities:

- Plan, organize, and implement activities daily and inform METAS Counselors to assist you
- Ensure the safety of the group and maintain a record of attendance
- Keeping the groups on scheduled activities
- Be a role model for youth by arriving on time, being respectful towards others, good language, and proper work attire
- Work collaboratively with other staff members to create a safe, positive, and fun environment for campers

- Assist with tear down and clean up at the end of the day
- Provide basic first aid to campers and complete the appropriate injury reports
